

2023-24 Boys Team Tennis Tournament

NJSIAA reserves the right to adjust, change or cancel dates, times, and locations for all NJSIAA State tournaments. Member schools will not be eligible to participate in any NJSIAA Tournaments if it has violated the NJSIAA Constitution, Bylaws, Rules, Regulations, Guidelines, Policies, or Procedures. Any student-athlete who transfers after the competition start date will not be eligible for this tournament (Bylaws, Article V, Section 4.K. 5).

Schools entering the tournament will not be granted a change of date/time due to any conflicts with school trips, proms, banquets, SATs, unless agreed upon by both schools. The NJSIAA will make every effort to accommodate schools that have a conflict with their graduation.

Schools that are disqualified from state tournament competition after the tournament has been seeded but prior to the bracket being final, then the bracket will be reseeded and the next ranked school who entered the tournament will be included. If a school is disqualified from state tournament competition after the tournament has been seeded and after the bracket is final, then the bracket will not be reseeded, and no additional school will be included. If a school is disqualified from state tournament competition during the state tournament, then the school will be removed from the tournament immediately and their last opponent will advance in their place.

Schools participating in any NJSIAA tournament are responsible for the actions and behaviors of their spectators. Schools are required to provide adequate staff security to ensure there is proper oversight of their spectators. In addition, schools are financially responsible for any damages to the property or premises caused by their student-athletes, staff, or spectators (spectators include, but are not limited to, cheerleaders, marching band participants, students, and other fans).

NJSIAA requires Certified Athletic Trainers at all its tournament events. The ATC must document all injuries on an injury report form. This form must be available to the NJSIAA upon request.

Member schools not willing or able to comply with these tournament regulations and any relevant procedures found in the Operating Procedures Handbook should not enter the tournament. Member schools are encouraged to review these tournament regulations with the school administration. Coaches must have a copy of these regulations as well as a copy of the Rule Modifications (if any) for this tournament available at all contests. Copies of these documents are available on the NJSIAA website.

New for This Year's State Tournament

- 1. <u>All</u> matches will be 10 point match tiebreaks, in lieu of full 3rd sets.
- 2. The NJSIAA power point system will be used to qualify schools into the 16 team brackets, but the seeding committee will review the brackets and <u>may</u> make changes to the seeds based on other factors, including: head-to-head results, UTR, record, winning percentage, and/or strength of schedule.
- 3. Team entry form must be completed online via the NJSIAA website.
- 4. The Group semifinals will be seeded, based on UTR, after section championships are claimed. Section championship teams will notify the tournament director immediately of any anticipated lineup change from the section title match. The tournament director will post the Group semifinal pairings as soon as possible.
- 5. The NJSIAA will pilot the seeding of teams, based on UTR, for the Group Semifinals, as opposed to the rotation of opponents based on section. Unless immediately notified of an anticipated lineup change at the end of the section finals, the tournament director will run a report, by position, to seed the qualifying teams based on UTRs. The tournament director will post the pairings as soon as possible after the reporting of all section finals.

A 10 Point Match Tie Breaker will be used for the Group Semi-Finals & Finals.

Tournament Rules & Information

- 1. The USTA tennis rules along with any NJSIAA tennis rule modifications will govern this tournament.
- 2. We ask schools to follow the tournament schedule above. Adjustments may be made based on weather and indoor court availability. Any modification to the play dates must be agreed upon by both schools. The tournament may not start before the round (1) date. The assignors must be contacted immediately if there are any adjustments.
- 3. Matches may start no later than 4:00 PM.
- 4. A minimum of three (3) courts must be available for tournament play (5 courts are preferred).
- 5. All courts utilized must be of regulation size and properly maintained for maximum safety.
- 6. When inclement weather necessitates playing indoors <u>on the rain date</u>, the higher seeded team will designate the site and both schools will share the expenses of the indoor courts up to and including the sectional finals. If the higher seeded team cannot secure a facility (indoors or outdoors) on the rain date and the lower seeded team can, then the location will be moved to the opponent's site.
- 7. Responsibility for postponing a match shall rest with the host school. It is recommended that the host school should notify their opponent before the departure of the visiting school's transportation at the latest.
- 8. Winning schools must report the results to <u>www.njschoolsports.com</u>, up to and including the sectional finals immediately following the completion of the match.
- 9. Schools willfully breaking tournament rules will forfeit the match in which the violation occurred. In cases of violation of the line-up regulation, the Forfeiture of Matches Provision of the NJSIAA Tennis Regulations will be in effect. The tournament director is empowered to enforce all NJSIAA Rules and Regulations and to disqualify any player for misconduct.
- 10. Any team or individual entering the tournament and then withdrawing will be subject to penalties as enforced by the NJSIAA, which could include possibly being barred from participating in the tournament the next school year unless truly extraordinary circumstances were present.
- 11. Participation by an ineligible player in any game during the regular season results in forfeiture of said game. If such forfeit(s) would have caused the school's failure to qualify for the tournament or if an ineligible player participates in a tournament game, said SCHOOL will be disqualified from the tournament immediately and their last opponent will advance in their place. Schools eliminated prior to the last opponent will not re-enter tournament competition.
- 12. Teams must be accompanied by a coach that has been approved by the school district. If a coach or coaches cannot attend, the school must send a chaperone approved by the school district. Coaches must supervise their players at all times and must be in attendance for the entire match.
- 13. All schools must provide adequate supervision to maintain crowd control throughout the tournament.
- 14. Coaches must have a copy of all challenge matches available at each match. Failure to provide the official challenge match form to the opposing coach will result in a one-game penalty, plus loss of toss, at each position, implemented before the start of the match.
- 15. Sets that reach a 6-6 score shall be decided by playing a 7-point tiebreak. See the rule below.
- 16. If sets are split, a 10 point match tiebreak will be played in lieu of a full 3rd set throughout the NJSIAA tournament. See the rule below.
- 17. Tournament will consist of a regular seven (7) player match; the team winning three (3) of the five (5) matches will be determined as the winner. The remaining matches at the semifinals and finals may be terminated after a team has won three (3) points only at the discretion of the tournament director.
- 18. Up to and including the sectional final, the home team will provide the tennis balls. Please note that new balls are NOT used during the 10 point match tiebreak. The NJSIAA will provide all the tennis balls for the Group semifinals and finals.
- 19. The Wilson tennis ball is the official ball and will be used for the Group semifinals and finals.
- 20. When possible, both teams should bring roll-dries for the Group semifinals and finals.
- 21. Players must wear appropriate tennis attire. School-issued/approved uniforms are mandatory. Manufacturers' logos may not exceed two and one-half (2 ½ x 2 ½) inches. Tank-tops, cut-off shirts or cut-off pants, or any article of clothing that is in poor taste or distracting to an opponent is not considered an appropriate uniform. All team players must wear identical shirts; all players must wear the same color shorts. A player not wearing an appropriate uniform, may not participate.

Awards

Sectional Champions:

A team trophy and fifteen (15) certificates to each Sectional Champion in each Group.

State Champions:

A team trophy and fifteen (15) certificates to each State Champion in each Group.

<u>TIEBREAK</u>

Sets which reach a 6-6 score shall be decided by playing a 7-point tiebreak. The first to reach 7 points by a margin of at least two wins the set.

SINGLES

<u>**A**</u> serves first point from right court; <u>**B**</u> serves points 2 and 3 (left and right); <u>**A**</u> serves points 4 and 5 (left and right); <u>**B**</u> serves point 6 (left) and after they change ends, <u>**B**</u> serves point 7 (right); <u>**A**</u> serves points 8 and 9 (left and right); <u>**B**</u> serves points 10 and 11 (left and right); and <u>**A**</u> serves point 12 (left). If points reach 6-all, players change ends and continue as before: <u>**A**</u> serves point 13 (right); <u>**B**</u> serves points 14 and 15 (left and right); etc., until one player establishes a margin of two points.

Changes of ends during a tiebreak are to be made without any delay other than the twenty (20) seconds allowed between points. There is no coaching allowed during a tiebreak.

Players change ends for one game to start the next set, with Player **<u>B</u>** to serve first.

DOUBLES

Doubles follow the same pattern, with partners preserving the sequence of their serving turns.

(Assuming $\underline{A} \& \underline{B}$ vs $\underline{C} \& D$) Player \underline{A} serves first point (right); \underline{C} serves points 2 and 3 (left and right); \underline{B} serves points 4 and 5 (left and right); \underline{D} serves point 6 (left) and after the teams change ends, \underline{D} serves point 7 (right) ... \underline{A} serves points 8 and 9 (left and right); \underline{C} serves points 10 and 11 (left and right); and \underline{B} serves point 12 (left). If points reach 6-all, teams change ends and continue as before: \underline{B} serves point 13 (right); \underline{D} serves points 14 and 15 (left and right); etc., until one team establishes a margin of two points. Changes of ends during a tiebreak are to be made without any delay other than the twenty (20) seconds allowed between points. There is no coaching allowed during a tiebreak.

Pairs change ends for one game to start the next set, with team <u>C</u> & <u>D</u> to serve first.

The set shall be recorded as 7-6.

10 POINT MATCH TIEBREAK

When the score in a match is one set all, one tiebreak game shall be played to decide the match; this is called a 10 point match tiebreak. The tiebreak game replaces the deciding final set. The player/pair who first wins 10 points, provided there is a margin of two points over the opponent(s), shall win this match tiebreak and the match. **New balls are NOT provided for a match tiebreak**.

SINGLES

<u>**A**</u> serves first point from right court; <u>**B**</u> serves points 2 and 3 (left and right); <u>**A**</u> serves points 4 and 5 (left and right); <u>**B**</u> serves point 6 (left) and after they change ends, <u>**B**</u> serves point 7 (right); <u>**A**</u> serves points 8 and 9 (left and right); <u>**B**</u> serves points 10 and 11 (left and right); and <u>**A**</u> serves point 12 (left). If points reach 6-all, players change ends and continue as before: <u>**A**</u> serves point 13 (right); <u>**B**</u> serves points 14 and 15 (left and right); etc., until one player reaches 10 points and establishes a margin of two points.

Coaching may occur on changes of ends during a match tiebreak, but the switching will last no more than ninety (90) seconds.

DOUBLES

Note that in doubles, the order of serving and receiving within the pair may be altered, as in the beginning of each set.

(Assuming $\underline{A} \& \underline{B}$ vs $\underline{C} \& D$) Player \underline{A} serves first point (right); \underline{C} serves points 2 and 3 (left and right); \underline{B} serves points 4 and 5 (left and right); \underline{D} serves point 6 (left) and after the teams change ends, \underline{D} serves point 7 (right) ... \underline{A} serves points 8 and 9 (left and right); \underline{C} serves points 10 and 11 (left and right); and \underline{B} serves point 12 (left). If points reach 6-all, pairs change ends and continue as before: \underline{B} serves point 13 (right); \underline{D} serves points 14 and 15 (left and right); etc., until one pair reaches 10 points and establishes a margin of two points.

Coaching may occur on changes of ends during a match tiebreak, but the switching will last no more than ninety (90) seconds.

The set shall be recorded as 1-0.

To Qualify for Team Tournament

- 1. Teams must be competing on a varsity interscholastic basis and sixty percent (60%) of the games played on or before the cutoff date must be against New Jersey schools.
- 2. The NJSIAA power point system will be used to qualify all teams for the tournament. Only NJSIAA full or federated member school games will count toward power points.
- 3. Games played after the cutoff date will not count toward the power point calculation, even if they were started before the cutoff date.
- 4. The top 16 teams from each section and each group will qualify for this tournament using the power point system.
- 5. Power point calculation for tennis will be using the <u>8 best</u> power-pointed games from opening day to the cutoff date, regardless of how many games were played.
- 6. Residual points earned from opponents will be calculated using the opponent's first 8 games played.
- 7. If there is a tie in power points, the current NJSIAA tie-breaking procedure will break all ties.
- 8. Teams that play less than 8 games will still be eligible for the tournament based on their total power points achieved at the cutoff.
- 9. Any player with two (2) or more disqualifications in the current season, prior to the start of the tournament, will be unable to compete in the state tournament.
- 10. Any varsity team accumulating three (3) or more player or coach disqualifications prior to the start of the tournament will not be permitted to participate in the state tournament. Seeded teams will forfeit their right to compete if a disqualification limit is reached prior to the start of the tournament for the team.

Entry Procedure

- 1. All varsity schedules & rosters must be entered in www.njschoolsports.com by the start of the season.
- 2. All varsity scores must be reported to <u>www.njschoolsports.com</u> as soon as possible after each contest. If you encounter problems, please contact <u>www.hssupport@njadvancemedia.com</u> as soon as possible.
- 3. Power points will be downloaded from <u>www.njschoolsports.com</u> at noon on the date listed above. Coaches are reminded that all team information must be totally up to date and checked for accuracy.
- 4. The team tournament entry form and officials "Conflict of Interest" form must be completed by the dates listed.

Tournament Seeding

- 1. The qualifying schools in each group and each section will be initially seeded into the brackets using the NJSIAA power point system.
- 2. If there is a tie in power points, we will use the current NJSIAA tie-breaking procedure.
- 3. Power points determine entry, but the seeding committee will review the brackets and <u>may</u> make changes to the seeds based on other factors, including: head-to-head results, UTR, record, winning percentage, and/or strength of schedule.
- 4. <u>The media may post brackets following the completion of the seeding meeting, however, seedings</u> and brackets do not become official until 12:00pm on the day after seeding.

Withdrawal of Player(s)

Sometimes, when a match has already been decided, a coach elects to withdraw their player(s) and forfeit the remaining match or matches, which will count as a loss on the individual player's record. This is within the rules of the game, although it is not fair, from an ethical point of view to the opponent. It is more acceptable in tournament play when a team must play another round later that day. Facility restrictions, weather, darkness, travel time, sickness, injury, and mutual consent are examples of justifiable reasons for withdrawing players. To arbitrarily do so, is discourteous and should not be done.

Officials Assignments & Fees

The higher-seeded school is responsible for contacting the appropriate regional assignor to obtain an official for all tournament rounds up to and including the sectional finals. The regional assignor must be notified of all date, time, or facility changes immediately. The assignors will make every attempt to have an official at every state tournament match. However, due to the shortage of officials, that may not be possible. The official's fee will be \$90. If a match is conducted at a site with less than 5 courts, the official's fee will be \$120. The NJSIAA will assign and pay for all officials starting with the semifinals and finals.
