(COACHES MUST HAVE A COPY OF THESE INSTRUCTIONS AVAILABLE AT EACH GAME)

To Qualify

Member schools must have competed on a varsity interscholastic basis to be eligible for team championship. Individuals from member schools who did not compete on an interscholastic basis or whose team has not entered the championship may compete for individual awards provided they meet entry qualifications.

Girls bowling on boys'/co-ed bowling teams will be eligible for the boys' state championships as team representatives for the Team Championships. Girls may also compete in the Girls Individual Championship if they qualify as an individual in the Girls Sectional Tournament. **Girls may not compete as individuals or be eligible for awards in the Boys' Championship, nor may they compete on a boy's team if they have competed as a member of a girl's team, at any time during the season.**

NOTE: Rule 2, Section 18 of the NJSIAA Constitution and Bylaws: All NJSIAA team entry forms must reflect competition of no less than 70% with New Jersey Schools by entry closing date (January 10, 2009). If a team does not meet this criterion, it will forfeit its entry into the NJSIAA tournament.

To promote fairness in competition and the health and safety of student athletes, no NJSIAA member school will be eligible to participate in any NJSIAA Championship Tournament if it has violated the Specific Sports Regulations for the sport including, but not limited to, the start of practice, the start and ending of the sport season, and the maximum contests permitted during the regular season. The application of this eligibility standard is non-appealable.

Please Note: Any varsity team accumulating three (3) or more player or coach disqualifications for flagrant unsportsmanlike conduct prior to the start of the Sectional Tournament will not be permitted to participate in said Tournament. Any bowler/coach disqualified for flagrant unsportsmanlike conduct two or more times in the current season prior to the start of the Sectional Tournament will not be allowed to compete in said Tournament.

SPECIFIC SPORTS REGULATIONS (found in the *New Jersey State Interscholastic Athletic Association Handbook 2008-2009 Constitution, Bylaws, and Rules & Regulations; Procedure for Boys/Girls Competition, page 125.*

RULE 12. Boys Bowling

Section 1. Rules The United States Bowling Congress Youth Rules shall govern all NJSIAA games.

Section 2. Start of Practice. – November 15, 2008

Section 3. Start of Regular Season. December 1, 2008.

Section 4. End of Season (From Rule 2, Section 10)

All teams may participate in interscholastic contests up to the final championship in their respective sports. Exceptions: Winter Track – Feb 28 (Golf will be up to and including the Friday before the NJSIAA championships in softball and baseball). Individual competition shall terminate with the end of said competition.

ENTRY GUIDELINES

Team Entries: One (1) team from each school consisting of five (5) bowlers. Each competitor will bowl three (3) games, winner determined by total pins. No handicaps will be permitted. **No school may enter both a team and individuals.** No school may have more than 5 bowlers in the settee area at any one time during competition. However, schools may practice up to 6 bowlers prior to the start of competition during the designated practice period.

Public and Non-Public schools will compete in a common bracket.

Individual Entries: All entrants qualify if they have an average score of 180 in a minimum eighteen (18) league games bowled up to and including January 2, 2009 which must be documented by the League Secretary and forwarded to the Sectional Director with the entry form. **No school may enter more than 4 individuals.**

Entries close Friday, January 9, 2009 and postmarked no later than Saturday, January 10, 2009. No team will be admitted after the deadline date.

FORWARD ENTRY FORM AND ENTRY FEE TO THE APPROPRIATE SECTIONAL DIRECTOR. SEND INTERACTIVE ROSTER TO NJSIAA, AND FAX ENTRY FORM TO NJSIAA, 609-259-3047.

THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE OF THE NJSIAA HAS RULED THAT MEMBER SCHOOLS FAILING TO FORWARD TOURNAMENT FORMS TO THE PROPER ADDRESS WILL BE EXCLUDED FROM TOURNAMENT COMPETITION IN THAT SPORT.

Team Entry Fee: A check for eighty dollars (\$80.00) made payable to the NJSIAA. Make certain the name of the school appears on the check. PLEASE DO NOT SEND CASH.

Individual Entry Fee: A check for fourteen dollars (\$14.00) per bowler made payable to the NJSIAA. Make certain the name of the school appears on the check. PLEASE DO NOT SEND CASH.

RULES: UNITED STATES BOWLING CONGRESS YOUTH PLAYING RULES will govern all tournament play. The open substitution rule will be in effect, except for Baker team games. **Any student accepting a cash/merchandise award (or have anyone accept cash/merchandise on his behalf) from a league or tournament will be considered ineligible.**

ENTRY FORM CHANGE(S)

Any changes from those players/coaches names that appear on the entry form must be submitted, in writing, to the Tournament Director prior to the start of the competition for the Sectional Championships. This written notice must be signed by the Principal, Athletic Director and Coach along with the reason(s) for the change and is effective for the entire tournament. {Maximum number for a team is fifteen (15) bowlers.}

GENERAL INFORMATION FOR TOURNAMENT

1. All scores are final once submitted and signed by the coach; however, the Tournament Director will have the authority to certify the official score.
2. Blind scores will not be permitted.
3. Schools will draw for lanes for Sectionals. Lanes will be assigned for the Tournament of Champions.
4. The NJSIAA will pay all bowling fees for the Sectional and Tournament of Champions games.
5. Contestant's name must appear on the entry form to bowl and coaches must bring a duplicate copy of the completed Entry Form to the Sectional and Tournament of Champions Meets.
6. EACH TEAM OR INDIVIDUAL MUST HAVE A COACH OR CERTIFIED FACULTY MEMBER PRESENT. Failure to comply will result in contestant(s) not being permitted to compete.

7. Member schools desiring a copy of the tournament results must provide the TOURNAMENT DIRECTOR with a self-addressed stamped envelope the day of the tournament.
8. **Proper attire must be worn: school issued shirts, no hats. PLAYERS WILL BE DISQUALIFIED IF NOT DRESSED IN SCHOOL ISSUED ATTIRE. Coaches will be responsible for informing athletes of this regulation.**
9. The NJSIAA and the bowling establishment will not be responsible for lost or stolen articles.
10. ONLY the Meet Director and his/her assistant are to be at the announcer's table.
11. Teams may practice before the start of the competition (if lanes are available) but they may not practice on the lanes designated for the championships. The NJSIAA will not pay for practice games or rental of shoes. NOTE: IT IS VERY POSSIBLE THAT LANES WILL NOT HAVE RENTAL SHOES IN ALL SIZES. AS A RESULT, SCHOOLS ARE REQUESTED TO COME PREPARED.
12. Postponement: In case of inclement weather, the Tournament Director will inform the Lanes management of the postponement. Coaches are urged to call the Lanes for information relative to the postponement and the site, time, and place of the rescheduled event.
13. Director will rule on any disputes.
14. **Smoking will not be permitted during the Tournament.**
15. **Schools are asked to please refrain from bringing into the bowling centers any outside food and beverage products, other than homemade.**

ATTENTION ATHLETIC DIRECTOR/COACHES

Schools entering individuals and not presently competing on an interscholastic basis are advised to read carefully the Procedures - "Coaches" Appointed to Accompany Teams or Individuals to NJSIAA Championships in the NJSIAA Handbook. Tournament Directors will disqualify any contestant who is accompanied by someone in a coaching capacity who is not properly certified and appointed by the Board of Education. A properly appointed coach will thereafter be subject to the Rules and Regulations, Rule 2, Section 11 - Out-of-Season Practice. If a substitute coach is used, written authority from the school's Principal must be presented.

PROTESTS

Protests based upon an official's judgement (Tournament Director), or misinterpretation, or misapplication of the playing rules will not be honored as per NJSIAA Bylaws, Article VII, Section 1.

DISQUALIFICATION

Participation by an ineligible player in any match during the regular season results in forfeiture of all points achieved by the ineligible player and the final results are adjusted accordingly. If such forfeit(s) would have caused the school's failure to qualify for the tournament or if an ineligible player participates in a tournament game said school will be disqualified from the tournament immediately and their last opponent will advance in their place, if applicable and feasible; schools eliminated prior to the last opponent will not re-enter tournament competition.

Disqualification Authority: The Sectional and State Directors have the authority to disqualify a coach/player for conduct unbecoming a student-athlete/coach, but not limited to, use of profanity, disorderly conduct, and/or flagrant physical or verbal misconduct. The player disqualified will not be replaced during that game. Normal NJSIAA rules will apply to the player who is disqualified. Schools are responsible for the conduct of their student-athletes and their spectators. Schools are subject to disqualification by the Tournament Director and/or NJSIAA officials in attendance for displays of unsportsmanlike conduct.

ATHLETIC EMERGENCY PROCEDURE

Each school participating in the tournament will provide for the care and treatment of their athletes within the school's policy as in effect during the regular season. The athletic emergency procedure of the participating schools will be in effect during the tournament which should include the establishment of a line of communication for emergent situations.

ATTENTION: Principals, Athletic Directors, All Coaches and Officials

RE: Recommended Precautions Against The Transmission of Blood-Borne Pathogens

All member schools must provide all coaches with the contents of the NJSIAA Infectious Disease Policy. The Infectious Disease Policy provides that:

If an individual gets someone else's blood on his/her skin, protective gloves should be worn to wipe the blood off with a disposable towel using soap and water.

Note: If any blood gets on an opponent's uniform during competition or a teammate's uniform during practice, it is not necessary to clean the uniform at that point unless the opponent or teammate has an open cut or unskinned area, or the blood is on a part of the uniform which might come in contact with mucous membranes. If the student-athlete does have an open cut or unskinned area or believes the blood might come in contact with mucous membranes, then the uniform should be wiped with soap and water.

ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES/ILLEGAL SUBSTANCES

Players and coaches involved with alcoholic beverages and/or illegal substances before, during or after the game, at the game site or on school property, including chartered busses, shall be suspended from NJSIAA tournament play for one year and be denied any championship rights.

This action was taken in support of the fact that such actions concerning alcoholic beverages and illegal substances are in violation of New Jersey State statutes and will be strictly enforced.

Smoking will not be permitted during Tournament play.

SALES/SOLICITATIONS

Only NJSIAA promotional items will be sold at NJSIAA sponsored events. For the 2008/2009 seasons, First Division is the designated vendor.

Solicitations, sale of publications or products, or similar activities are NOT permitted without prior authorization from the NJSIAA.

The New Jersey State Interscholastic Athletic Association is the sponsoring association for all levels of State Tournaments/Championships. The NJSIAA reserves all rights in regard to the management of these Tournaments/Championships and the sale or distribution of any items and any audio-visual reproductions. Any sale or distribution of clothing, souvenirs or any other items is strictly prohibited without the permission of the NJSIAA.

Note: SCHOOLS NOT WILLING OR ABLE TO COMPLY WITH TOURNAMENT REGULATIONS SHOULD NOT ENTER THE TOURNAMENT.

WITHDRAWAL

Any member school and/or student-athlete withdrawing from competition after having officially entered an NJSIAA tournament in any sport will be disqualified from all remaining NJSIAA tournament competition in that sport in that season and barred from participating in NJSIAA tournament competition in that sport during the next school year unless truly extraordinary circumstances were present. (Rule 2, Section 17, Rules and Regulations: NJSIAA Handbook). The tournament director may replace a team/individual qualifier that withdraws with the next finisher in the Sectional.

TO QUALIFY: The Champion and Runner-up in each Group in each Section will advance to the team Tournament of Champions. The top nine (9) contestants in each Section with the highest three (3) game series (total pins) will advance to the individual Tournament of Champions and will be eligible for the individual awards in the individual Tournament of Champions. Sections having forty (40) or more schools entering teams will advance the top twelve (12) individuals; fifty or more schools entering teams will advance the top fifteen (15) individuals.

Additional Tournament Information:

1. The boys who qualify for the Individual Tournament of Champions will bowl 3 games. **All individual bowlers will move to the next assigned pair to the right after each game in this round within a cluster of 6 lanes.**
2. At the conclusion of the third game, the top 18 bowlers in the individual championship will advance to an additional round of 3 games which will begin at approximately 2:00 p.m. The top 18 bowlers will be based entirely on the 3 games bowled at 12:30 p.m, with no carryover from the Sectional. Bowlers will move a pair of lanes to the right after each game in this round. Ties for the 18th position will be broken by a two frame roll-off (9th and 10th frame). If a tie still exists after the two frame roll-off, a one frame roll-off(s) will be conducted until the tie is broken.
3. At the conclusion of the three games bowled at approximately 2:00 p.m., the top 5 bowlers will begin a step-ladder final based on the 6 game total bowled earlier in the day. The step-ladder will begin at approximately 3:00 pm. All ties for the top five seeded positions will be broken by a complete game roll-off. However, if the 4th and 5th seeded positions are tied, the seed will be awarded to the bowler with the higher 2:00 p.m. series.

4. **Schools will be assigned by the Sectional Tournament Director to a Group within the Section based solely on enrollment. The classifications for bowling will be determined by the actual number of teams entered in the Sectional Tournament, with the top 25% and any fraction assigned to Group 4, the next 25% and any fraction assigned to Group 3, the next 25% and any fraction to Group 2, and the last 25% assigned to Group 1. The enrollment figures will be taken from the 2007-2008 NJSIAA Group Classifications. PLEASE NOTE THAT SCHOOLS ARE STILL ASSIGNED TO SECTIONS BASED ON THE COUNTY THAT THE SCHOOL IS LOCATED. If two or more schools tie for a Sectional Group Championship, co-champions will be awarded, however, only two schools will advance to the Tournament of Champions. A Baker team game will be conducted to determine the two teams that advance and the school with the highest pin total will be assigned to a lane as the Sectional Group Champion with the second highest pin total assigned as the runner-up. NO MORE THAN TWO SCHOOLS FROM A GROUP WITHIN A SECTION WILL ADVANCE TO THE TOURNAMENT OF CHAMPIONS.**
5. **The Group Champions and Runners-ups in each Section will compete for State Group Championships and an overall State Championship at the Team Tournament of Champions. Teams will move a pair to the right within a cluster of ten lanes within their respective group in the team Tournament of Champions. If two or more schools tie for a State Group Championship, co-championships will be awarded, however, a single traditional team game will be conducted over ten lanes to determine the school that advances to the Overall State Championship round.**
6. **The overall State Champion will be determined by a Baker Competition between the State Group Champions. The Group Champions will be seeded by pin total. The Baker teams will consist of 5 bowlers with Seed 1 vs. Seed 4 and Seed 2 vs. Seed 3 competing in a best 3 of 5 games. The winners will compete in a best 3 of 5 Baker games to determine the Overall State Champion.**

AWARDS

SECTIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

1. Trophy and up to fifteen (15) certificates for the first place team in each Group in each Section.
2. Trophy to the individual with the highest single game in each Section; a silver medal to the 2nd place finisher in each Section; and a bronze medal to the 3rd place finisher in each Section. No individual will receive more than one (1) single game award.
3. Trophy to the individual with the highest three game series in each section; a silver medal to the 2nd place finisher in each section; and a bronze medal to the 3rd place finisher in each section.

TOURNAMENT OF CHAMPIONS

1. Trophy and up to fifteen (15) certificates for the first place team in each Group.
2. The Group Champion with the highest pin total will be seeded first for a Baker elimination tournament to determine the Overall State Champion. The Group Champion with the next highest pin total will be seeded second, the next highest seeded third, and the next highest seeded fourth. The Group Champions will compete in a Baker best of 3 of 5 with seed 1 vs. seed 4 and seed 2 vs. seed 3, with the winners competing in a Baker best 3 of 5 for the Overall State Championship.
3. Trophy and up to fifteen (15) certificates for the Overall State Championship team. (T of C Champ).
4. Trophy to the boy with the highest single game; a silver medal to the 2nd place finisher; and a bronze medal to the 3rd place finisher. No boy will receive more than one (1) single game award. These awards are based on the three games bowled in the team Tournament of Champions.
5. Trophy to the boy Individual Champion; a silver medal to the 2nd place finisher and bronze medals to the 3rd through 5th place finishers in the step-ladder final. A high game award trophy will be given to the boy with the highest game in the three games bowled in the 12:30 p.m. session. Silver and bronze medals will be awarded to the bowlers with the second and third high games. No boy will receive more than one (1) single game award.

NOTE: DUPLICATE AWARDS WILL BE GIVEN IN CASE OF TIES. BOTH AWARDS WILL BE PRESENTED TO AN INDIVIDUAL WINNING BOTH THE HIGH GAME AND HIGH SERIES. TEAMS WHO ARE TIED FOR FIRST PLACE IN GROUP CHAMPIONSHIPS WILL BE DECLARED CO-CHAMPIONS. GROUP CO-CHAMPIONS WILL BOWL A SINGLE GAME ROLL-OFF TO DETERMINE THE TEAM THAT ADVANCES TO THE BAKER ROUND. SEEDS FOR GROUP CHAMPIONS THAT HAVE THE SAME PIN TOTAL FOR THREE GAMES WILL BE BROKEN BY THE PIN TOTAL FOR THE THIRD GAME, THEN THE SECOND GAME.

The Star-Ledger and NJ.com shall have the right to enter into license arrangements with such third parties.
- C. The Star-Ledger and NJ.com may create NJSIAA programming for distribution over media outlets owned or controlled by Advance Publications.
- D. Notwithstanding anything herein to the contrary, including but not limited to Sections A and B above, NJSIAA member schools may broadcast regular season (but not playoff, post-season tournament, or championship) athletic contests involving such schools' own teams or athletes, without charging any fee to any viewer or other third party, on such schools' own commercial-free television networks, their own commercial-free websites, or on commercial-free public access television channels (provided that any agreement between an NJSIAA member school and a commercial- free public access television channel does not permit sublicense or other use of the telecast).
