

2024-25 NJSIAA SOFTBALL TOURNAMENT

NJSIAA reserves the right to adjust, change or cancel dates, times, and locations for all NJSIAA State tournaments. Schools entering the tournament will not be granted a change of date/time due to any conflicts with school trips, proms, banquets, SATs, unless agreed upon by both schools. During the spring tournament season, we will make every effort to accommodate schools that have a conflict with their graduation.

Member schools will not be eligible to participate in any NJSIAA Tournaments if it has violated the NJSIAA Constitution, Bylaws, Rules, Regulations, Guidelines, Policies, or Procedures. Any student-athlete who transfers after the competition start date will not be eligible for this tournament (Bylaws, Article V, Section 4.K. 5).

Schools are to be reminded of the 3-team DQ rule for state tournament eligibility, which states "Any varsity team accumulating three or more player or coach disqualifications prior to the team's participation in the state tournament will not be permitted to participate in the state tournament."

The NJSIAA will follow the procedure below for schools that are disqualified from state tournament competition:

- 1. If a school is disqualified, either for the use of an ineligible player or violating the 3-team DQ rule, from state tournament competition after the tournament has been seeded but prior to the bracket being final, then the bracket will be reseeded and the next ranked school who entered the tournament will be included.
- 2. If a school is disqualified, either for the use of an ineligible player or violating the 3-team DQ rule, from state tournament competition after the tournament has been seeded and after the bracket is final, then the bracket will not be reseeded, and no additional school will be included.
- 3. If a school is disqualified from state tournament competition <u>due to the use of an ineligible player</u> during the state tournament, then the school will be removed from the tournament immediately and their last opponent will advance in their place.

Schools participating in any NJSIAA tournament are responsible for the actions and behaviors of their spectators. Schools are required to provide adequate staff security to ensure there is proper oversight of their spectators. In addition, schools are financially responsible for any damage to the property or premises caused by their student-athletes, staff, or spectators (spectators include, but are not limited to, cheerleaders, marching band participants, students, and other fans).

NJSIAA requires Certified Athletic Trainers at all its tournament events. The ATC must document all injuries on an injury report form. This form must be available to the NJSIAA upon request.

Member schools that are not willing or able to comply with these tournament regulations and any relevant procedures found in the Operating Procedures Handbook should not enter the tournament. Member schools are encouraged to review these tournament regulations with the school administration. Coaches must have a copy of these regulations as well as a copy of the Rule Modifications (if any) for this tournament available at all contests. Copies of these documents are available on the NJSIAA website.

New for this year's state tournament

- 1. The new PowerPoint system will be used for this tournament.
- 2. The NJSIAA will assign all rounds of this tournament.
- 3. All out-of-state / non-member games will count towards PowerPoints

If schools do not agree, then it must be played on the date listed. If any date is moved by mutual agreement, the potential next round of opponents must be notified ASAP. No tournament game may be scheduled on or before Memorial Day.

For the state finals, the team with the higher PowerPoints will be the home team and use the first base dugout.

To Qualify for the Tournament

- 1. Teams must be competing on a varsity interscholastic basis and sixty percent (60%) of the games played on or before the cutoff date must be against New Jersey schools.
- 2. The top 16 teams from each section and each group will qualify for this tournament using the PowerPoint system.
- 3. Games played after the cutoff date will not count toward the PowerPoint calculation even if they were started before the cutoff date.
- 4. If there is a tie in power points, the current NJSIAA tie-breaking procedure will break all ties.
- 5. Any player with two (2) or more disqualifications in the current season, prior to the start of the tournament, will be unable to compete in the state tournament.
- 6. Any varsity team accumulating three (3) or more player or coach disqualifications prior to the start of the tournament will not be permitted to participate in the state tournament. Seeded teams will forfeit their right to compete if a disqualification limit is reached prior to the start of the tournament for the team.

PowerPoint Procedure

The PowerPoints earned from each game are based on the sum of Quality Points and Residual Points, which is then multiplied by a strength of schedule factor (OOWP). The sum of each game's power points will then be averaged, and the result will be your team's PowerPoints. All PowerPoints will be rounded to three (3) decimal places where applicable.

Formula:

Step 1: (Quality Points + Residual Points) x OOWP = Game PowerPoints

Step 2: (Sum of Game PowerPoints) / Number of Games = Team PowerPoints

Notes:

- 1. All games played from opening day to the cutoff date will count, regardless of how many games are played.
- 2. Softball predetermined minimum number of games is 16. All teams that fall below this minimum number are still eligible for the playoffs, however their points will be divided by the minimum number of 16.
- 3. Residual points will be awarded based on your opponents' first 16 games.
- 4. Ties will be calculated only for sports where the regulations state ties are acceptable outcomes.

<u>Out of State / Non-Member Opponents</u> – Games against out-of-state or non-member opponents will count for power points and will follow the same calculation procedure as games against member schools except they will be assigned a .500 record for the purposes of residual points and OOWP calculations.

PowerPoint Tie Breaking Procedure

- 1. Head-to-Head Competition. Any ties involving 3 or more teams, move to step #2
- 2. Average quality points per game.
- 3. Average residual points per game.
- 4. Average OOWP for all opponents.
- 5. Common opponent winning percentage
 - a. Example: Team A is 3-0 (100%) vs. team C and team B is 2-0 (100%) vs. team C, go to #6
 - b. Example: Team A is 2-1 (.667%) vs. team C and team B is 1-1 (.500%) vs. team C, Team A wins Tiebreaker
- 6. Team total winning percentage
- 7. Coin Toss

The tie breaking procedure above includes all contests from the competition start date to the cutoff date.

Entry Procedure

- 1. The entry form must be completed online during the time period listed above.
- 2. The Officials Conflict of Interest form must be completed by the date listed above.
- 3. All varsity schedules & rosters must be entered in njschoolsports.com by the start of the season. Rosters must be checked and updated, if necessary, by the start of the tournament. We cannot guarantee any roster changes made after the start of the tournament will make it into the tournament program.
- 4. All varsity scores must be reported to www.njschoolsports.com as soon as possible after each contest. If you encounter problems, please contact hsupport@njadvancemedia.com.
- 5. PowerPoints will be downloaded from the njschoolsports.com website on the date listed above at noon. The seeding committee will use this information to seed the tournament. Coaches are reminded that all team information must be totally up to date and checked for accuracy.

Tournament Seeding

- 1. The qualifying schools in each group and each section will be seeded using the NJSIAA power point system.
- 2. Teams will be seeded based on their power point totals.
- 3. If there is a tie in power points for seeding, we will use the current NJSIAA tie-breaking procedure.
- 4. The media may post brackets following the completion of the seeding meeting, however, seedings and brackets do not become official until 12:00pm on the day after seeding.

Tournament Rules & Information

- 1. All current NFHS softball rules along with any NJSIAA softball rule modifications will govern all tournament games.
- 2. All game times for all rounds up to and including the state semifinals will be designated by the higher seeded (home) team. The recommended start time for school days is 4:00pm. For non-school days, times will be established by the home team.
- 3. All game times are pending the official's availability. Athletic Directors must communicate consistently through all rounds of the tournament regarding start times and field locations.
- 4. The NJSIAA may need to determine the start times if there is any disagreement between schools.
- 5. Game times for all state group championship games will be established by the NJSIAA.
- 6. Rounds one (1), two (2) and three (3) games may be played earlier than the dates indicated if both schools agree. If schools cannot agree, the game must be played on the play by date. Regular season/tournament games scheduled for these dates must be rescheduled.
- 7. The public & non-public sectional finals, and the public semifinals are "play on" dates. Host schools must get approval from the NJSIAA to play these games on a different day.
- 8. If any circumstance causes postponement, the game must be played on the next day. If the home team cannot get their field ready the next day, the home team has to either find a neutral site or move to the opponent's field if playable. If the next day is a Sunday, the game may be played if both schools are permitted to play on Sundays, otherwise, the game must be played on Monday. Non-NJSIAA regular season or tournament games must be moved.
- 9. After a second consecutive postponement of a game because of field conditions, and the home team cannot get their field ready, the NJSIAA director of softball may designate an alternate site as the home field for the higher-seeded team which may include the opponent's field of the lower-seeded team.
- 10. Responsibility for postponing a game shall rest with the host school. It is recommended that the host school should notify their opponent before the departure of the visiting school's buses if possible.
- 11. The NJSIAA assignors must be notified of any postponement in a timely fashion.
- 12. A maximum of twenty-five (25) uniform players, four (4) coaches, three (3) support personnel, and a trainer will be permitted in the Dugout. Dugouts may be extended away from home plate if needed.
- 13. After twenty-five (25) uniform players, to be identified and designated on the line-up card, are presented to the umpire at the beginning of the game, no additions to the card will be permitted.

- 14. The winning school must notify njschoolsports.com immediately after each game, which must include the pitch count information.
- 15. Fields should be lined in accordance with the National Federation Rules.
- 16. Sites will not be declared unsuitable merely because recommended minimum fence distances are not available, or field conditions are less than perfect unless Leagues or Conferences have ruled such sites unsuitable for League or Conference play. However, NJSIAA staff reserves the right to move a game to another site if the field conditions are not considered to be suitable for competition.
- 17. The host school must provide an adequate amount of crowd control/security as needed based on the host school's facility.
- 18. The visiting school must provide at least one (1) staff member, not associated with the coaching staff, to be present at each tournament game to maintain control of visiting spectators.
- 19. Any member school withdrawing from competition after having officially entered the tournament may be fined or barred from participating in NJSIAA tournament the next school year unless truly extraordinary circumstances were present.
- 20. Participation by an ineligible player in any game during the regular season results in forfeiture of said game. If such forfeit(s) would have caused the school's failure to qualify for the tournament or if an ineligible player participates in a tournament game, said SCHOOL will be disqualified from the tournament immediately and their last opponent will advance in their place. Schools eliminated prior to the last opponent will not re-enter tournament competition.
- 21. Only Optic Yellow softballs meeting NFHS & NOCSAE specifications may be used in the tournament. The home team will provide the game balls. At the State Finals, all game balls will be provided by the NJSIAA. The Wilson A9011 Optic Yellow softballs will be the official ball for the State Finals.

Extra Innings Procedure

- This procedure applies to all state tournament games that are tied after seven (7) complete innings and any
 ensuing completed innings.
- 2. Starting with the top of the 10th inning, the offensive team shall begin its turn at-bat with a runner on second base.
- 3. The player who is scheduled to bat ninth (last) in that respective half inning will be placed at second base.
 - Example If the number 5 batter is to lead off, the number 4 batter in the batting order would be placed on second base.
- 4. A substitute may be inserted for the runner.

Umpire Assignments

The NJSIAA will assign all umpires for all rounds of the tournament.

Rounds 1, 2 & 3

- 2 umpires will be assigned to these rounds by the NJSIAA.
- Higher seeded schools will pay the umpires at the regular season rate.

Sectional Finals

- NJSIAA state assignors will assign 3 umpires for this round.
- NJSIAA will pay for all umpires.

State Semis-Finals (Public Only)

- NJSIAA state assignors will assign 3 umpires for this round.
- NJSIAA will pay for all umpires.

State Finals

- NJSIAA state assignors will assign 3 umpires for this round.
- NJSIAA will pay for all umpires.

Awards

Sectional Champions:

A team trophy and twenty-five (25) certificates to each Sectional Championship in each Group.

State Champions:

A team trophy and twenty-five (25) certificates to the State Champion in each Group.
